The original idea of Proteoglycan Forum was conceived during my conversation with Dr. Keiichi Yoshida (former Director of the Seikagaku Laboratory) in 1997. Traditionally, there had been very active proteoglycan research groups in western regions of Japan (i.e., Nagoya, Kobe...), and they held regular meetings on proteoglycans to exchange research ideas, foster active collaboration, and provided a portal to recruit new and young investigators from other research fields. In the eastern regions of Japan, however, there were no such regular meetings. We felt it would be an excellent idea to hold regular meetings in the east as well (not out of competition between east and west, but

simply to provide more opportunities as a matter of logistics and to reduce time and expense of traveling long distances) to further expand scientific interests on proteoglycan in Japan. Then, Tokyo would be a convenient and strategic location to hold meetings.
